The Exam [80 minute paper]

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| 1. Comprehension | A short Latin passage with questions to answer in English. | 15% |
| 2. Translation | A short passage and sentences to translate into English. | 55% |
| 3. Grammar | Questions on noun / verb endings, grammatical terms, etc. | 20% |
| 4. Background | Questions on Greek legends and Roman life. | 10% |

The exam will be based on a C.E. Level 2 paper.
