


#### Ski Trip 2018

# **World Book Day Thursday 2 March 2017**



#### Lower School


The Lower School was abuzz with books on Thursday as we opened decorated classroom doors to a vast array of characters from Alice in Wonderland to swashbuckling pirates and several creative costumes involving lions, witches and wardrobes.



In a day of interactive storytelling, character hot seating and poetry, Year 2 explored some of Aesop's fables whose messages hold true today, while Year 3 jumped down a rabbit hole with Alice in Wonderland to write acrostic poems and share books. It was full steam ahead on the Hogwart's Express for Year 4 and Year 5 who embraced the gruesome delights of Horrible Histories. Highlights of the day included a paired reading half hour during which Upper School children visited our younger pupils to listen to them read and a Lower School House book quiz in which teams from Headley, Norbury, Ranmore and Wisley pitted their wits against each other to answer questions ranging from the much loved, 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' to children's classics including RL Stevenson's 'Treasure Island'. Snatching victory by just half a point, the team from Wisley proved to be the ultimate Lower School literay champions.

The fun did not stop there as all children from Year 1 in the Pre-Preps through to Year 5 worked together over a 24 hour period to write their own children's story inspired by Rod Campbell's book, 'Dear Zoo'. Year 1 created three lovely animal characters, each with their own distinctive personality traits and Year 2 used their ideas to produce the story start. Year 3 then took up the baton by penning the story build-up, followed by Year 4 who introduced the problem of the evil 'Animal Catcher' which then gave Year 5 the challenge to resolve the dilemma and tie up the loose ends. The project resulted in some fantastic ideas from across the school and proved to be a great way for the children to experience the importance of revising and improving upon their initial ideas. The final product was shared in Assembly and is now available to view here.

Our Year 8 scholars visited our three pre-prep schools to spend time with the children there, while the Lower School created their own book and decorated some very attractive doors. The book fair is still going strong in the library! Meanwhile, our catering team laid on a special World Book Day lunch complete with lashings of frobscottle!

We are delighted to announce that World Book Day donations raised a total of £656.07 for Epilepsy UK.




### **Book Fair**
