

Design & Technology Summer Term Review

The year ends in Design and Technology with a flurry of activity to finish projects.

The year 2 pupils moved from the Workshop to the Textiles Studio this term to design and make vibrant woven fish mobiles. These projects



will be on display in the new term. Exploration of lunar buggies in Year 3

produced some fantastically original designs. We have been delighted how the children have engaged with this project, using their initiative and Science skills to investigate and solve design problems, considering weight to power ratios, friction and balance. The Food Tech room saw an invasion from outer space with



the making of Martian Rice Krispie cakes. We were delighted to have played our part in securing the GOLD level award for Space Mark scheme. Children have also used their graphic skills for moving pictures and superheroes.



Year 4 children enjoyed more baking in the Food Tech room with Mr Mitchell. Some great skills and understanding to help out more at home. In Textiles the children finished the year constructing Native American Wigwams, using CAD skills to create their repeat patterns and a range of workshop and textile studio skills.

Year 5 pupils lit up the workshop with animal inspired torches, learning about recycling of plastics as well as using their Science knowledge to build a working circuit.



Adventurous projects in Year 6 have produced some stunning lamps. Pupils have explored a range of materials and solved electrical circuit problems to ensure their lamps function has expected.

Following the huge success of the acrylic clocks, Year 7 pupils have used their CAD skills to design a logo for a fellow pupil, laser cut a stencil and print fabric using the sublimation papers



and heat press. These unique patterns will be used to create a mobile device holder next term.

To round off their year in Design and Technology, pupils in Year 8 returned to the Food Tech room to make burgers, risotto and cheesecake with Mr

Turvey. They were also given an opportunity to reflect of their
