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Our school was very much on show today with a healthy number of visitors joining us for our latest Open Morning. As always, our pupils proved to be the perfect hosts, with our guides demonstrating their enthusiasm for all areas of school life. Our recent announcement clearly prompted the increased levels of interest and we hope that we were able to convey our vision for the expansion of Downsend. I have been heartened by the support and kind words of so many parents over the past week, with the overriding response being how exciting it is be part of such an exciting, caring and forward-thinking school. On behalf of the staff at Downsend, thank you for this overwhelming show of solidarity – it means a lot to us all. That innovative approach to learning was very much in evidence at the Surrey Round of the Science

Quiz Challenge earlier in the week, won for the second year in a row by our teams. Well done Years 5 and 6 and good luck in the Regional Round!

On Wednesday, I hosted a Q&A session with Year 6 parents in the Pavilion, and will be scheduling similar events with Years 5 and 4 over the coming weeks. We will then proceed through the Year groups to ensure that we engage fully with our parents. The observations and questions were as insightful as they were valuable and I have already prepared a summary of the conversations, which we will circulate to all Year 6 parents today. This will form part of a central Q&A document, which we will make available to all parents, both existing and prospective. I will also be setting up a Parent Engagement Group, to meet half-termly, to assist with getting all of the details right over the next few months. If you are interested in joining this Innovation Group, please keep an eye out for further details.

Next week I will be attending the Cognita Global Conference and will not be returning to Downsend until Friday afternoon. I will have limited access to E-mail, but will try and respond to any messages I do receive. I will be deep in conversation with Senior Heads at our Cognita partners about the GCSE and DofE provision, so it will be a fruitful and productive week for Downsend so please contact Mr Watts in the first instance or Mr Newland and Miss Black if you have a query about the Upper or Lower School respectively. It will be a busy week for the DPA as they prepare for the Christmas Fair; please do show them the same support you have shown to our school over the past week – that support goes a long way!

Anti-Bullying Week and ARK Week

Downsend is currently in the middle of two important pastoral weeks in its calendar. This week we have marked National Anti-Bullying Week. On Monday we introduced 'Odd Sock Day'. This gesture of wearing odd socks highlighted that it is acceptable to be different rather than making fun of people who are. A simple action that makes this point. Throughout the week there has been an Anti-Bullying Workshop for the Upper School, separate assemblies throughout the school and individual PSHE classes focusing on anti-bullying.



This week we have marked National Anti-Bullying Week and on Monday we introduced 'Odd Sock Day'. Next week is ARK Week. ARK stands for 'Acts of Random Kindness' and is designed to be a proactive approach to enhance relationships throughout the school. It is about giving with no expectation of recognition.. The entire Downsend community will be taking part. So how does it work? Each class will hold a 'ballot' and be allocated a secret friend in that class.. We are keen for secrecy to be maintained throughout the week. The secret friend does kind and anonymous gestures throughout the week such as a note or a small gift. It begins on Monday and runs all week.



Anti-Bullying Workshops

The whole of the Upper School were treated to a new Virtual Reality Anti-bullying workshop. All pupils were involved in a workshop where they were immersed into a bullying situation and had to make decisions on how each character acted, why they did what they did and what advice they could give them. It gave them an opportunity to really focus on both the victim and the bully in a most realistic way. If it has given the pupils a chance to voice concerns and highlighted the importance of reporting bullying incidents, it will have been worth it!



Bullying is a worrying part of many children's experience in school and can extend beyond to the workplace too. If we can do anything to make pupils more aware and able to tell someone about it, we will have helped in a small way. More than 16,000 people are absent from school due to bullying. We at Downsend would like to see this number reduced. With the introduction of the Peer Mentor scheme, the growing awareness in schools of Safeguarding, PSHE lessons and the tutorial system to name just a few of our pastoral initiatives, Downsend is committed to trying to reduce the incidents of bullying throughout the school.


Collection boxes for Jolly Bags and House Tables are in the turret area which I will clear each evening.

Spectacular Science

There is never a dull day, week or month in the Science department and this week has emphasised that more than ever. It has been a week about enriching our learning of Science and inspiring young minds to think further about Science and how STEM subjects can lead to exploring the wider world and jobs.

On Tuesday, I took two teams of enthusiastic young Scientists to compete in the first round of the Quiz Club Prep Schools Challenge. Both teams performed extremely well and produced scores well over 1000. There were a number of questions where both teams scored 100%, showing clear learning and extension of recent topics in their Science lessons. Unfortunately only one team can triumph and for the second year in a row Downsend won with a score of over 2200, 500 points more than second place and beating their last year score by over 400 points. The semi-finals will take place on 06 December.

On Wednesday 15 November, I had the privilege of taking 10 Year 8 students to a TeenTech event at the Surrey Sports Park. Here they met leading specialists in Science, Technology and Maths and played with 3D printers, old and new technology and even worked as apprentices to build guttering. I was enormously proud when they were awarded with the 'top gadget' prize for their innovative 'I drive U drive' USB stick.







Hannah's Trip Blog

"Ten year 8 children were chosen from Downsend to go on the STEAM trip. Our trip to TeenTech was absolutely amazing. There were 320 children who took part in this extraordinary event, and to begin, we were asked to draw a picture of a scientist or what we thought a scientist looked like. When we had finished we were asked by a lady how many people had drawn women or girls as their scientist, 62 out of 320 said that they had. This may sound like a low number but only 5 years ago they only had 15 women drawn!

We then ran a formative assessment quiz which we answered on mini key pads to assess our understanding of STEM jobs, our enthusiasm and our belief in what a STEM job looks like.

In groups of 100 we completed a rotation of three things. The first event we did was to invent a gadget that we had to present in front of the other schools; we had 45 minutes to come up with an idea which we called "I drive, U drive". Our final idea was a high security car that controlled who was driving, how fast they were driving and where they were going: so that children driving or any other people who were driving. We had created a very secure car. We were so fortunate to have won the award "the best gadget" which was the last and best prize!

When we finished we went into the room next door, where we were looked at different companies. The first one was a facilities management company; they had actually worked on things like the Olympics and different car companies, we wore special kits, did some building challenges, which were harder than they looked. Then we went over to the 3D printing stand, where we learnt how to make plastic key rings with our names imprinted on them. They also showed us lots of different fragile models that had taken them a long time to make, they were pretty impressive!

Our final rotation were a few smaller but equally exciting expeditions. For example we resuscitated an almost real baby, understood how technology changed in the video and audio world, redesigned bird flu, drugs testing for our elite sports athletes, looked at how ships were made and finally learnt about the ever changing world of vaccines!


We thoroughly enjoyed this trip and came back looking more positively about STEAM jobs than we had done at the beginning of the day." Hannah G


