Jersey Hockey and Football Tour





Jersey 2017

After an early start (really early start....) the Downsend tour party left school in the darkness of 5am bound for the airport and Jersey. Spirits were high in spite of the lack of sleep. Travelling through the airport went well and the children should be commended for their independence and maturity through the day.

On arrival we travelled to our accommodation to drop off our luggage before heading to the Durell Wildlife Centre. We were greeted by three Andean bears as we entered the zoo before travelling around and seeing gorillas, flamingos, orangutans, bears, otters and many more amazing creatures. We enjoyed a hearty lunch before we had our first fixtures of tour.

The boys faced Victoria College Prep School. All three teams showed real determination throughout their matches, defending resolutely and creating a number of chances. Sadly it was one of those days when the woodwork, goalkeepers and rough bobbles prevented the goals from flowing. All three teams lost against strong opposition.

Arriving at Jersey College Prep School our opposition were waiting for us pitch side and offered the teams a wonderfully warm Jersey welcome. The girls played well to notch up 2 convincing wins with excellent team play. A great start to our fixture programme.

The children returned to the hotel and settled into their rooms. Following this we all hit the hotel pool for a swim to freshen up. After dinner, a very tired group of children headed up to bed.

Great weather, blue skies and warm temperatures greated us in the morning. A large buffet breakfast prepared us all for another full on day!

The girls saw the return of the Downsend Hockey Challenge. The four teams competed fiercely over four skills based tasks and are all excited who will be crowned champions 2017. After an encouraging day of football yesterday for the boys, they set to with real enthusiasm on the practice drills ready for the afternoon matches.

After training, we arrived on St Brelade Beach and the children sped off to take part in a multitude of activities: cricket, hockey, wave chasing, sand sculpting, football and tag to name a few. A short coach ride to Pizza Express in St Helier and a hungry crew of children were fed and watered in record time.

This afternoon's hockey matches against St George's Prep School gave the girls their first taste of mixed hockey. Both Downsend teams emerged victorious, demonstrating great team work, skill and composure.

The boys enjoyed a great afternoon of football this afternoon against ID Elite Academy with one draw, one loss and a win. All three matches were incredibly competitive and the boys played well throughout.

Following another three course dinner, we all headed to the Jersey Bowl for a game of bowling. The children had a fantastic time with some competitive and at times, highly entertaining games of bowling. There were many great performances but the winner of the 'Kingpin of the day' went to Mrs Fitch with a score of 128.

In spite of the storm warnings for 'Storm Brian' we awoke on Saturday to blue skies and sunshine. We travelled to Mont Orgueil castle, which towers over the lovely harbour town of Gorey. The children split into a number of groups and explored this fascinating castle. The children got the chance to dress up as knights and princesses, get put into the stocks and see the different fortifications.

The boys were then transported to their fixture against St Clement's FC. With the expected torrential rain and high winds it had been decided to move this fixture to an indoor venue. All three teams played with determination and endeavour to secure three wins. The boys should be very proud of their efforts across all three matches and this was a fantastic way to finish the tour on the pitch.

Jersey hockey club hosted the last girls' fixture in windy but surprisingly sunny weather. Determined to maintain our winning record, the girls set about their task in an efficient and focussed manner scoring frequently in both matches and defending when needed in a calm and controlled way. Their style of play attracted many admiring comments from the Jersey coaches and parents which made us very proud of them all.

Everyone then journeyed to St Helier to do some shopping. Some bought clothes, some bought souvenirs and some bought sweets! The children behaved really well showing some good manners.

We finished the day in Dante's function room (essentially a mini night club for children), where the tunes blared from the speakers as the children bopped up and down. Dabbing, knee slides and break dancing were all on display on the dance floor.

Our final day was a day to pack up and travel home. This tour party have been superb. We received so many lovely comments about the children's behaviour and manners throughout the tour and we are enormously proud of them.

Equipment:

9 Talented U11 Players: Natasha C (c- attack), Chloe M (c- defence), Josie D (GK), Rhianna P, Geraldine H, Elizabeth H, Gracie N, Elspeth W, Mia H.

- 2 Focussed coaches
- 20 Enthusiastic parents
- 2 neutral umpires per game
- 1 under size pitch with poor surface

Method:

- Start the day early with drive to Pipers Corner School, Wycombe, arriving 08:15.
- Ensure 2 captains clear on their roles for the day.

- Set up base camp and warm up.
- Play 6 matches across the course of the day.

Results:

- Game 1 vs Holy Cross Drew 0-0
- Game 2 vs Hall Grove Won 3-2
- Game 3 vs Gayhurst Won 8-1
- Game 4 vs Oratory Won 1-0
- Game 5 vs Pipers Corner Won 7-1
- Game 6 vs High field Won 3-0

Final position:

Silver medal winners losing out on the top spot by goal difference.

Conclusion:

Under usual circumstances a draw and 5 good wins would be more than enough to take you through to National Finals. However, with an unusual situation of only one team qualifying from this regional tournament the initial draw in match 1 vs Holy Cross, meant we were then in a precarious position needing to win and score as many goals as possible in every remaining game.

The challenges of the small pitch size and poor surface compromised the style of hockey that could be played and enabled the less technical teams to hold up play effectively by just physically taking up the limited space available in the shooting areas. This led to inexperienced neutral umpires awarding numerous short corners instead of playing advantage which slowed the game considerably and wasted on average around 1/3 of the playing time in each game. When you mix this with a running clock and the need to score regularly, this quite simply became a real frustration for the players, coaches and spectators alike.

Despite the huge disappointment for all in failing to qualify, it is important to reflect on how well the girls played throughout the day. They scored some insanely brilliant goals and played, despite the challenges of pitch, the style of hockey, which is synonymous with Downsend School. Both Miss Ceci and myself were immensely proud of the whole squad and how fantastically they represented Downsend School both on and off the pitch.

We still have much of the season to play and plenty more tournaments where we hope to add to our medal haul and trophy cabinet.
