U11 Boys Surrey Hockey Tournament

Last Wednesday we took an U11 boys team to take part in the Surrey Plate hockey tournament at Woking Hockey Club. This was a first in Downsend's sporting history and a fantastic achievement as the boys made it through to the final.

A small group of year 6 boys took the opportunity to join the Upper School boy's hockey club which started in January during a lunchtime. The majority of the boys had never picked up a hockey stick before and their attendance was intermittent due to the 11+ exams. They all worked hard and were really keen to learn the new skills especially 3D skills such as lifts, flicks and spins.

The team played their first 'fixture' against the U11 A and B girls from Downsend and Esher Church High school on the Monday of the week of competition and showed lots of raw potential. They were fast and eager to score goals and it was a great opportunity to learn some of the rules of hockey! Huge thanks to all the girls who played as this really did help the boys prepare for the tournament.

Heading to Woking on the Wednesday morning, the boys were given a hand out with the rules of the game on one side and umpires signals on the back, kindly put together by Oliver F. Our first game was against Meath Green and was a nice, gentle opener for the boys to settle their nerves and pick up 3 points. Three more pool games were then quickly played in succession against Trinity (2-0 win); Whitgift B's (4-0 win) and St Andrews (7-0). Scoring 21 goals and conceding 0 in Pool B ensured Downsend topped the group and play the runners up of pool A – Dulwich College B's. A much tougher game which

was 1-1 at half time. A good half time chat allowed the boys to focus on "doing the basics well" which resulted in 3 well taken goals and a fantastic 4-1 win putting the boys into their first ever hockey final.

Our opposition in the final, St George's, are a well-established hockey school and we knew they were going to be tough. The first half saw the boys continue to play some good hockey and create numerous attacking opportunities. They were unlucky to concede a goal and be 1-0 down at half time. The second half we quickly pulled a goal back and then we were unfortunate to have a couple of injuries. The boys legs' were tiring fast and their 'raw' skills deteriorated as a result. St George's capitalised on this and scored three easy goals as we just could not find the energy to track back.

A fantastic effort by the whole squad with awesome stats. 26 goals scored; 5 goals conceded. A special mention to William K who played in goal having only put the GK kit on twice before the tournament and all the boys who had only started playing in January. Well done to Oliver F and William K as joint captains.
