Cognita Conferences

This week I have been very fortunate to be able to attend two inspirational Cognita conferences. On Tuesday, Melanie Piper and I were with colleagues from across Europe to share best Safeguarding practice. We are continually looking to improve our knowledge and understanding of how to keep our children safe and we both felt it was a highly valuable day. There was a particular emphasis on helping children to build their resilience and self esteem to avoid any mental health issues in the future.

On Wednesday, Christeen Hill joined me at the Cognita's Senior Leadership conference which was held at the Emirates Stadium. The focus for the morning was on the importance and ways of achieving personalised learning. This was followed by educational workshops addressing issues such as giving children a global perspective, improving communication and using an Ecopod to develop problem solving skills. The whole day was most thought provoking and we have already shared our intention to "be the best at getting better" with the children, - a mindset that we would like them all to adopt.
