Welcome from the Headmaster

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

Have a great weekend and thank you again for all your support this week!




World Book Day





Scholastic Book Fair



As Thursday's Scholastic Book Fair had to be cancelled due to the snow, we have rescheduled this to Monday 5th March from 3.45pm to 5.00pm in the School Library. There will be over 200 titles for you and your child to choose from and prices start from £2.99. Your child can also use their World Book Day £1 token towards payment.

If you are happy for your child to order and buy some books, there are a variety of ways this can be done:

They can bring in a Scholastic Gift voucher to spend at the Book Fair (which means you are happy for them to make their own choices on what they buy at the Book Fair). Gift Vouchers can be purchased online before the Book Fair at bookfairs.scholastic.co.uk/parents.

Books can be ordered and bought by parents (cash or cheque) on Monday 5th March from 3.45pm to 5.00pm in the School Library.

Brilliant Books!

The Lower School has been awash with books, traditional fable telling, quizzes and stunning writing as our younger children embraced a week-long celebration of the power of reading. Assemblies were devoted to exploring the craft of a writer, the fruits of a joint fable writing project between Year 1 and 2 and a fun quiz in which the children used clues to guess their teachers' favourite childhood books.

While a magical show and storytelling sessions had to be postponed on Thursday as the visiting theatre company were unable to make it through heavy snow, Lower School pupils were unperturbed. The school brimmed with book characters ranging from Harry Potter to Wild Wooders in The Wind in the Willows, while classroom activities included book scavenger hunts, word quizzes, craft and creative writing. The younger children also created stunning book covers and blurbs describing their favourite books. Meanwhile, an Inter-house writing competition, designed to inspire the children to write either a short story or poem, ran throughout the week in the Lower School. Children have until Friday 9 March to submit their writing to earn ten house points for their House and the top two entries in each House will also win book vouchers. Let your creative juices flow Lower School and keep reading and writing!





Downsend Fables



On a beautiful day, the sun shimmered on the turquoise sea and the waves crashed onto the sandy beach.


But unaware to anyone something scary was happening down in the deep sea.

All entries <u>must</u> have your **name**, **form** and **House** attached.



Artist of The Week


This week's Artist of the Week is Maria B in 3NL.



'Compose your own jingle, background music and sound effect to the likes of Tom & Jerry, Scooby Doo, Bugs Bunny and Pokemon'.



A digital download is emailed directly to parents and a Certificate will be given out in assembly at the end of each term. This course is administered directly by M:Tech and so to register your child's interest please sign up online at www.mtechonline.co.uk or contact Pia, Rebecca or Ann on 01483 578114.

M:Tech costs £165 per term with weekly sessions of 30 minutes. Please note: It is important to understand M:Tech is not a club or an activity. It is a group instrumental lesson teaching creative composition with a clear graded learning curve, therefore we apply the same terms and conditions as for instrumental lessons notice is required by half term in order to stop at the end of term.
