

A digital download is emailed directly to parents and a Certificate will be given out in assembly at the end of each term. M:Tech costs £165 per term with weekly sessions of 30 minutes. Please note: It is important to understand M:Tech is not a club or an activity. It is a group instrumental lesson teaching creative composition with a clear graded learning curve, therefore we apply the same terms and conditions as for instrumental lessons <u>notice is required by half term in order to stop at the end of term.</u>


