With a record score of 88.7% A\*-B grades last year to match up to, the pressure was on, but the Class of 2018 have delivered some style. Having received the results of 333 separate papers sat, marked by a range of Senior Schools, imagine our surprise (and delight) when this talented cohort returned an A\*-B score of ..... 88.7%! There were smiles, shrieks and the odd tear when parents were informed of individual successes. Most importantly, the pupils responded with their customary maturity and humility about their success. We are very proud of them all!

Earlier this week, I was interviewed by one of our 8-year olds as part of her journalism competition entry. Her questions were thoughtful and challenging and, at one point, she asked me for 3 highlights relating to being the Headmaster at Downsend. I talked about being privileged to watch events like 'Downsend Rocks' or 'Downsend's Got Talent' and marvelling at the varied talents of our children. I elaborated on how well our children perform in CE and Scholarship exams. I explained how I enjoy seeing us perform so well at National Swimming Festivals or local cricket and rounders competitions. Finally, I explained that being around such energetic individuals keeps you young in readiness for events like the DPA Ball tonight, attended by almost 200 parents and pupils. The girl thought for a moment and asked if those were my highlights for the year and smiled when I replied that these were just my highlights for this week! If you read on, you'll understand why, as proud as we are of our CE results, we are even more proud of the wonderful all-round contribution made by so many Downsend pupils! I look forward to seeing many of you at Painshill Park tonight for the DPA Ball, where we can raise a glass to their remarkable successes!

The winning acts are:


Third place - Starz (Dance act by Jada J and Holly H)

Second place - The Shimmers (Flute, Trumpet and Gymnastics act by Lisa N-J, Megan R and Alice U)


First place - Funky Flautist (Flute by Adam V)

### **News from Epsom Pre-Prep**



Pre-Prep Epsom are delighted to have been awarded Millie's Mark. The Millie's Mark endorsement provides reassurance that all school staff know what to do in a paediatric first aid situation. It acknowledges that children's safety is at the forefront of thought when caring for children.

The <u>Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)</u> guidelines, which Early Years settings in England are required to follow, currently state that just one person with a current paediatric first aid certificate must be on the premises and available at all times when children are present or on outings. Millie's Mark is awarded as a special endorsement to Early Years settings that **go above and beyond these minimum requirements** by having 100% of staff trained (including the Headteacher and administrative staff) in paediatric first aid, and also ensuring that everything learned during the course is kept alive and in the forefront of practitioners' minds so that they are confident, ready and capable.
