At Arromanche-les-Bains we enjoyed ice creams and a picnic lunch on Gold Beach as well as a quick paddle in the sea. The visit to the 360 cinema brought the history to life with vivid images and film that the children will never forget. We ended the day with a rather competitive French quiz.

Day 2 was French history, culture and cuisine of the local town, Bayeux. Not only did the children enjoy seeing the Bayeux tapestry, depicting the Battle of Hastings in 1066, they also had the opportunity to use their French when buying fresh produce at the market, in readiness to prepare their own feast back at the chateau. This proved to be a highlight of the trip for some students. In the heat of the day we cooled down with an inter class mini-olympics which involved a great deal of water! 7RH were triumphant and Mrs Mercer congratulated them with a major soaking from the water hose.
