U11A Cricket Team win the prestigious Surrey Verney Cup Competition!

On a hot Tuesday afternoon the U11 A cricket team played back to back matches to win the prestigious Verney Cup Competition. Playing in the semi-finals against Rokeby at 12.15pm, we won the toss and batted first. Getting off a strong start we scored 107 off 16 overs against a strong Rokeby bowling attack. Special mention goes to Alex D who scored 40 runs and Louie L who was unbeaten on 30 not out. Ralphie A and Zac S struck the ball well, finishing the game with a 6 from Zac. In return Rokeby started very well and at one stage we were struggling to cope with their aggressive hitting and running between the wickets. Luckily for us the boys stayed focussed and Isaac R managed to turn the game with a spell of 4 wickets in 3 overs, including some outstanding fielding by all. Zac taking 2 wickets and Ralphie 3 in their respective overs completing the game with Rokeby stranded on 67 out all. A thoroughly convincing performance, where

teamwork, focus and determination were exceptional. Having already played 32 overs, our final was against the very large boys only school of Kings College Wimbledon, who arrived fresh for the final having secured their place last week. We lost the toss, but were happy to once again bat first. Unfortunately we knew that KCS's bowling was very strong and we didn't quite apply ourselves early on. Within 8 overs we were 5 down for only 35 runs and facing a very difficult situation. This was until Sam B, Jack M and Luca C-S demonstrated that we are a true team and all our boys can bat and bowl! Sam scored an invaluable 28 Not Out, brilliantly supported by Luca who scored 19 runs, before Charlie K hit three 4's in a row off the final over. We completed our innings on a very impressive 107 again and felt confident we had a chance of the win. A great start by Alex and Isaac (3 wickets) with the ball, followed by tight bowling by Jack M and great fielding by Angus W, Ralphie A, Harrison G-S and Charlie K was too much for KCS. The catch of the session by Luca behind the stump (one of 3 as wicket keeper!) enabled us to take the price wicket of Max from KCS and in doing so the game. KCS finished on 62 and the Cup was won! To have been in such trouble yet come through and pull together again was amazing to watch. Having worked with these children since I started at Downsend and to see them dominate the surrey circuit has been a really privilege for me and one I am incredibly proud of. Well done to all the team, including the injured Curtis T who couldn't play in the semi or final, so assisted as manager!

Surbiton Hockey Club Gold Medal Camp

The Gold Medal Camp is aimed at school years 1 - 11 and will include coaching from Argentine superstar and Olympic Gold Medallist Gonzalo Peillat as well as GB superstar and Olympic Gold Medallist Giselle Ansley - without doubt two of the biggest superstars in world hockey.

Gonzalo Peillat

Olympic Gold Medallist, World Cup Bronze Medallist and leading drag flicker in the world will be coming Surbiton. Gonzalo is a former FIH International Rising Star of the Year winner and has played at both London and Rio (Gold). He also won a bronze medal at the 2014 World Cup in Breda where he was top goal scorer with ten goals. Gonzalo was also hugely influential in Argentina's gold medal success at Rio finishing the top goal scorer in the competition with 11 goals.

Gonzalo has scored a staggering 176 goals in 153 appearances for Argentina and he's still only 26.

We are delighted that we can welcome Gonzalo to SHC on the 22/7 as there really is no bigger star in men's world hockey at the moment!

Giselle Ansley

Giselle is one of the most coveted players in international hockey at the moment with a combined 143 caps for England and GB. Another drag flick specialist Giselle famously won an Olympic Gold Medal at Rio and has repeatedly won domestic league and cup competitions in the UK. She is currently number one drag flicker for GB and is a great role model for any young player.

We are delighted that Giselle will coach on our camp on the 23/7!

Team Sheets

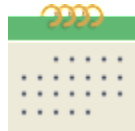
