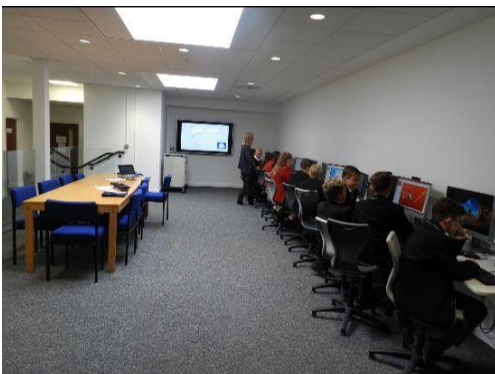
I hope that you find access to the VLE a useful tool and that it improves communication as well as keeping you well-informed.

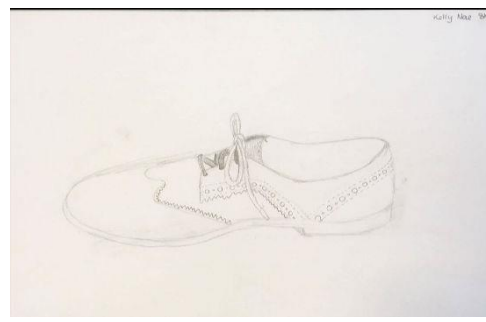

Is there anything you need to do to prepare? We thought a little FAQ might help you answer all of those burning questions....

Q: Do I need to register myself and my family to attend?

A: If you are thinking of coming, it would be brilliant if you could register on Class List so that we can get an idea of numbers.... But if you are waiting to see what the weather is like before committing, that's fine, you can turn up on the day

Q: Can I bring my friends with me?

Q: How much will it cost?

get glittered up or have a refreshing drink. Also if you want to enter the Downsend Dog Show, there is an entry fee.

Q: Can we get anything to eat there?

A: Absolutely! Dougie will be running his famous Downsend Dawgs stall and offering meat, vege and gluten free hot dogs. We also have the Ice Cream man coming to visit as well as some naughty but nice sweet treats on offer. Don't forget to bring some cash for these!

Q: Where can we park?

A: Please feel free to use all available parking spaces at Mainsite, and if we get full don't worry, our excellent Chief Parking Marshall Paul will be on hand to direct you to St Andrews School where we will have over flow parking facilities. We encourage all our drivers to be patient and polite in case it is busy in the car park, we will squeeze you in where we can.

Q: What will happen if it rains?

A: Well, like all good British Festivals, we have a back-up plan. Depending on how bad the weather is, we may move into the Sports Hall for the event but we will let you know via Class List if plans change. If the weather is really bad, we will cancel the Dog Show and run it another time

Q: I am thinking of waiting to decide and then turning up on the day – is that ok?

A: Of course, we are hoping as many people attend as possible – so if you prefer to go with the flow, that's no problem at all
