Mrs Jones was attached to the rope and the children played a different role as they helped each other to pull and heave the turnip until eventually the turnip went POP! Not only did this develop the children's literacy skills but also their STEAM skills, as they investigated the best way to chop each vegetable using their scissors or a knife. The children made lots of thoughtful comments on the shapes they had created as they chopped. The learning has been brilliant and so much fun as the children continue developing their storytelling and mathematical language.
