## Downsend Alumnus named in England's Test Series Squad



Former Downsend pupil and Epsom-born batsman, Dominic Sibley, has been named in the 15 member squad for England's two match Test Series against New Zealand in November.

The following game against Rokeby the Under 7's fought back brilliantly after conceding an early goal and with a brilliant move that involved Oscar S and Harry J, with the ball eventually breaking to James S who was fouled in the box. James S dusted himself off and dispatched the penalty with ease to bring Downsend level. Unfortunately neither team could find a winner and the points were shared.

Downsend couldn't improve in their last game and unfortunately they ran out of energy and Cranmore showed a killer instinct in front of goal to put the game out of sight within the first half. The boys worked their socks off to get back in the game but were up against a superb Cranmore keeper who kept the attack at bay.

Well done to everybody that took part. The boys will be a lot stronger for the experience and will be raring to right the wrongs of this tournament later in the term. Many thanks to all the parents for giving up their time to support on a beautiful Saturday morning.
