


### **'STRETCH'**


### Science CREST Club 4:30 - 5:30pm (£5 Fee) Miss Patel - S4


#### Lego Engineering 4:30 - 5:30pm (No Fee) Ms Haq - ICT Suite


Public Speaking 4:30 - 5:30pm (No Fee)


### Science Escape Rooms 4.30 – 5.30pm (No Fee) Mrs Sagar - Lab 5


#### Philosophy Film Club 1:45 - 2:15pm (No Fee) Mrs Bilham - T4
