



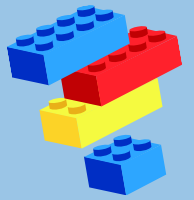

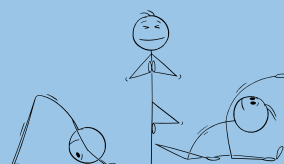

Wrap-around care



Please be reassured that our wrap-around care programme will continue in the Autumn Term 2025.

All wrap-around care will commence from Wednesday 3rd September 2025.

We will send out a communication including details of how to book prior to the end of term.

Early Birds and Breakfast **7:30am - 8am** **£7.50**

Held in the Dining Hall, where the catering team will be offering healthy breakfast items from 50p (cash only please).

Junior Prep - Y3 to Y6 **After school until 4:20pm** **No charge**

Children will do their homework or read quietly from when their school day finishes until 4:20pm

There is no prep on the last day of term due to the school closing earlier than the usual departure time.

If your child is attending a club that starts later than the end of the school day, your child will automatically attend prep. *Please only sign up for prep if this is the only requirement.*

Extended Day **Until 5:45pm** **£15**

Sandwiches and fruit platters are available and included in the price.

Please note that if you collect after 5:45pm, there will be a late charge issued to your account for each occasion.

There is no Extended Day on the last day of term due to the school closing earlier than the usual departure time.

Emergency Ad-hoc

We do understand that there are occasions when booking in advance is not possible.

In the event that you need to book your child for Prep or Extended Day on the day, please complete the 'JS End of Day Arrangements' Form on Cognita Connect by 1pm or call the reception team.

Clubs

After seeking feedback from the children, we have reviewed our club programme and are delighted to offer some new clubs such as Basketball, Yoga, Electronics, Future Skills as well as the favourites which they continually request. We have continued to work on providing a range of clubs for each year group throughout the week.

- Clubs will run from **Wednesday 3 September** until **Friday 5 December 2025**.
- Prep and Extended Day will continue until **Tuesday 9 December 2025**. Early Birds will continue until **Wednesday 10 December 2025**.
- To assist with sibling collection, for those parents who have siblings coming out of clubs at different times, we are happy to offer Extended Day to fill the short gap (around 20 minutes) at no extra cost. Once the clubs have been confirmed, you will have the opportunity to book this provision.

Payments

Once the club places have been confirmed, you will be asked to make payment prior to the start of term. Internal clubs that carry a charge will be uploaded onto ParentPay and external clubs will be payable to the club provider direct.

If a club is externally run, you will be sent further details about how to make payment. Payment must be made in advance to secure your space.

By signing up for a place at an externally run club, you give permission for your contact details to be passed on to the external club provider.

An exciting opportunity for students in Years 5 and 6 to learn how to compose, arrange and produce music for a project of their choosing. Students can learn how to: Write a hit song in a popular music style, or compose and produce a video trailer for their favourite Film/TV show or computer game.

Starting with the basics, students will be guided through a course in Garageband to create a full piece for the style of their chosen project. Using a vast library of digital instruments and effects, students will learn about the elements of music and how to use them to create drum grooves, interesting chord progressions, exciting bass lines and catchy melodies. They will gain an understanding of the key musical concepts of rhythm, harmony and melody, progress their keyboard and listening skills and build creativity through discovery, improvisation and exploration of their own musical ideas.
