- Charges will be added to your account on ParentPay at the start of the Autumn Term, unless the club is externally run, in which case you will be sent further details.


By signing up for a place at an externally run club, you give permission for your contact details to be passed on to the external club provider.

Join Forest School where we will enjoy everything that the outdoors has to offer. If you enjoy building fires, learning rope skills & outdoor survival then this is the club for you.


After October half term: Classroom based


Target Shooting 7.30 – 8.30am (£204 per term, Max 12) Daniel Bavin - External Provider - Sports Hall


Drama club 4.30 – 5.30pm (No Fee) Mr Bryant - Linford Theatre


Creative Music Tech 4.30 – 5.30pm (£96 fee per term) Sam Keer (External Provider) - Mac Suite, Music Room 1


Botany Club 1:45 - 2:15pm (No Fee) Miss Gore - S2
